Regardless of the perception, the bird poop is full of dangerous bacteria, it smells bad, is unsightly, and very costly to clean up. Wild pigeon feces can present a potential hazard from infections such as

Campylobacter and Salmonella via fecal-oral transmission when contaminated bird feces is accidentally swallowed or inhaled.
