How Do Excel Clubs Help?

Each Exchange Excel Club selects projects based on the needs of the school, community concerns, and/or skills that club members want to improve upon. The members with the help of a school advisor and sponsoring Exchange Club member lead the club, decide on how to serve their school and community, and get actively involved.

Excel members typically share their time and talents to develop and execute projects, such as planning a prevention of child abuse activity, organizing a school clean-up day, collecting food for the underprivileged, setting up a grade school tutoring program, and adopting "grandparents" at a local nursing home.
