I would like to thank the volunteer Board of Directors (BOD), staff and most importantly, **our members and volunteers** for another record year for financial membership support. **With 42 new and first time Friends of Hullett (FOH) members** in 2022, our community-based organization continues to grow from a varied base of different user types. The annual **Pheasant Challenge** showed FOH once again that supporters want to see the continued release of pheasants for public hunting opportunities!

This past year saw major infrastructure upgrades with the dredging of the **Butterball Pool and Whistler Pool canoe/kayak channels**. The **Blue Trail bridge** was completed in 2022. As we move ahead in 2023 major projects include reforestation and habitat maintenance. FOH staff will be mentoring 1 high school co-op placement from February to June. Staff have applied for 3 Canada Summer Job positions for 2023.

Excitement is building for the return of the **Annual Spring Charity Dinner and Auction** after a 3 year COVID hiatus. Please see page 4 of this newsletter for details.

The AGM will be held this spring and final details to be sent out via email in April. This is your chance as a member to express your ideas and concerns in person. Members can choose to run for Board positions at the AGM as outlined in page 6 of this newsletter.

Roads and Parking Lots



Throughout the winter months, accessing Hullett Marsh can be difficult. Interior roads including Front Road, Burns Line, Conservation Road, Bridge Road and Sanctuary Line **do not** receive winter maintenance within the Hullett Marsh boundaries. FOH would like to

remind users to use interior roads at your own risk. Please respect and follow any <u>road closure</u> that may occur within the Marsh. These are for your safety.

During the winter, two parking lots will have snow removed from them as staff time and availability permits. These locations are: **40672 Hydro Line Road and 80602 Wildlife Line.** Please be patient with FOH staff as we remove snow from these parking lots.

Snowmobiles at Hullett

Throughout the winter season, **Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs** (OFSC) mark trails throughout Ontario, allowing snowmobilers to get and enjoy the outdoors. Specifically, the Huron Trail Groomers Club are responsible for the trails that travel through Hullett and surrounding areas.

FOH staff would like to remind everyone using these trails to **please stay on OFSC marked trails**. Snowmobiles leaving marked OFSC trails create a safety concern and can disturb wintering wildlife. Additionally, to prevent

damage to agricultural land, please stay off of trails deemed CLOSED.

The **22nd Annual Pheasant Challenge** was another record breaking year and ensured **the 2023 pheasant hunt.** FOH would like to thank everyone who purchased tickets and embraced our online **PAYPAL ordering system.**

A huge thank you goes out to our sponsors <u>Sommers</u> <u>Generators</u> for generously donating the generator and <u>Clinton Sporting Goods</u> for providing the shotgun and allowing physical ticket purchases at their store.

Breaking last year's record once again, 1093 tickets were sold this year! **Congratulations to our winners drawn on January 18th, 2023!**

Over the past season, **1200 pheasants** – supplied by Sarah and Audrey Jackson of <u>Uplands Pheasantry</u> and Ralph Gerber of <u>Creekside Pheasantry</u> – were released into **Zone B between September and December.**



Pheasant Release Program 2023

The release program will continue for the fall 2023 pheasant hunt! **Hunters blew us away in 2022 with their financial support for the program**. With \$2,404 in direct cash donations, \$10,930 from the Pheasant Challenge and proceeds from the INSTAGRAM Auction we have funding for a **1000 - 1200 bird release in 2023.** Each pheasant has a price tag of approximately \$14 per bird plus administration and release costs.

Bluebill & Whistler Canoe Channel Improvements

With years of sediment buildup, the Whistler and Bluebill canoe channels were in dire need of being cleaned out.



With the help and generosity of the Ontario Federation of



Anglers and Hunters (OFAH), Friends of Hullett was able to clear out the debris and improve the quality of both of these channels.

FOH invested over \$33,000 into this project and are very grateful

to the OFAH for their generosity as they provided \$8,000 in funding to put towards this project. With the knowledge and expertise of both Vandriel Excavating and Merner Contracting, were able to complete both channels before the weather and marsh conditions rendered the areas inaccessible.





The completion of this project significantly improves the user experience and allows for much easier access via canoe or kayak to other areas of the property.

Tree Planting & Forestry

With the assistance and guidance of Treemendous Trees, Friends of Hullett has invested in planting an



assortment of 25 Kentucky Coffee and Tulip trees in the plantation area located in the Northeast portion of Zone B. These trees will help to recover the stunted forest that currently exists there from a tree plantation project that occurred

many years ago. FOH staff spent considerable time scouting and preparing the area as well as watering and tending the newly planted trees to help ensure their long term viability.

Moving forward, more trees will be planted in areas



throughout the marsh in areas where the current forest cover is dominated by less desirable and invasive species such as Autumn Olive and Glossy Buckthorn.

By planting various species of native trees in these areas. FOH is better able to combat the spread of invasive species as well as close in the canopy where

there are gaps to create a

continuous forest. Currently, staff are working on developing a planting plan for another Zone B plantation that will be completed as a part of the 50 Million Trees Program and will further help to create a continuous forest within Zone B.
