Message from the Board

After a harsh winter, Friends of Hullett (FoH) are eager to get out and make an impact on Hullett Marsh in 2025. *This year brings some exciting changes*: the prairie grass fields are beginning their transformation, grants from the **Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters** will contribute much needed equipment and property improvements, and funding from **TD's Friends of the Environment Foundation** is helping FoH protect turtles within and beyond Hullett Marsh. At the time of writing, FoH has already planted 158 trees and shrubs in Zone A, begun acoustic monitoring for bats, repaired bridges, and surveyed and serviced all of Hullett's mallard tubes and duck boxes! This building momentum brings exciting new possibilities to Hullett and helps deliver on FoH's mandate.

HPWA is a *Multi-Use* property and *respecting each other's activities safely is important*. FoH has published <u>hunting</u> and <u>hiking</u> "tip sheets" to help you research, understand and enjoy your visits! We hope to see you at the **Annual General Meeting on May 25** (page 5).

I would like to thank the volunteer Board of Directors, staff and most importantly, the membership and volunteers for their efforts and donations. This year's **Charity Dinner and Auction** is a testament to the commitment of our supporters – be sure to read more about it on page 6 of this newsletter!

Looking ahead to the summer, **Justin Johnson** and **Ben Elliott** are building a team of students and volunteers to work at the HPWA. **Emily Dearing** has returned to helm the creation of the 2025/2026 Hullett User Guide and run our 2025 Turtle Nest Protection Program. We also have 2 funded Canada Summer Job positions for 2025 with a third position that will be funded by FoH. These positions offer exciting early career opportunities to explore the potential of the Wildlife Conservation field and help FoH deliver stewardship projects both large and small. We are currently hosting a two-credit co-op student from St.Anne's; you can read more about **Ethan Willert** on page 2 and be sure to say hello if you see him in the Marsh!

Trail Maintenance/June to August:

- Pruning, trimming, cleaning, and paint blazing
- Firewood gathering

Nesting Mallard Tube Retrieval/August and September

Using waders, kayaks and canoes to bring in the tubes after the nesting season

Zone A Hunt Stake and Canoe Channel Maintenance/ **August and September**

- Cutting and marking walk-in trails to hunting
- Repair and cut shooting lanes at accessible hunting stands
- Canoe channels to ensure proper signage and navigability

OFAH Funded Projects

Invasive species of Hullett Marsh beware! Friends of Hullett have received \$6000 for equipment to support our invasive species control program! This funding from the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH)'s Community Conservation Fund will support the purchase of new backpack sprayers, a vehicle mounted tank sprayer, chemical storage lockers, mixing tables and more! Many of the invasive species at the Marsh have reached an abundance that requires chemical control. These species, including invasive Phragmites, Garlic Mustard, and Buckthorn, are best controlled through careful application of chemical spray; however, plant pulling is still an effective control method for some species and under certain cricumstances. The equipment will be criticial this fall as we plan to battle invasive Phragmites again alongside the Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority – more to come soon!



Addtionally, Friends of Hullett recieved \$5000 from OFAH's Community Projects Fund to rebuild another accessible hunting blind. Pictured above, this blind will be removed and replaced with a brand new struture that will provide additional opportunities for hunters, hikers, and photographers to experience the best of Hullett Marsh! Thank you to OFAH for all the support in making this project a reality!

Field Conversion

Friends of Hullett are breaking ground on a large-scale restoration project in 2025. The prairie grasslands adjacent to parking lots 40672 Hydro Line Road and 81044 Wildlife Line will be transformed into a fresh and reinvigorated grassland! The existing fields will be sown into soybeans in 2025 to prepare the space for grassland planting in the coming years.



The transition from dense monoculture Bluestem grassland has been long overdue as the density of the vegetation made the space unsuitable for birds to forage and breed. This new grassland will support a variety of species including Mallard, Eastern Meadowlark, and Bobolink! Friends of Hullett are very excited to watch the grass grow and make hay for habitat at Hullett Marsh!

2025 Fall Pheasant Release

Based on available funding, the 2025 hunt will see **1000 pheasants** released throughout the fall season! Friends of Hullett is appreciative of the continued support from hunters and other supporters of the program as they make this hunt possible.

Water Access Restictions

Water access (for any purpose) is not permitted in the HPWA from May 15 to July 31 in Zone A and May 15 to July 15 in Zone B annually to minimize the disturbance to nesting waterfowl. This includes retriever training activities, wading, canoeing, and kayaking. 🧺

TD FEF: Turtle Nesting **Program and Workshop**

Despite their slow pace, work dedicated protecting turtles is gaining ground. Friends of Hullett were honoured to receive a \$5000 grant to support turtle work in Hullett Marsh courtesy of the TD Friends of



the Environment Foundation. Funds will be used to construct fifty additional nest protectors, initiate a photomonitoring program, and improve signage to inform visitors about turtles in the Marsh! We will also be hosting a nest protector building workshop on May 14th where you can learn about the use of protectors, how to build them, and bring a completed nest protector home with you!
