

- 25 The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul that seeks him.
- 26 It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.

 - when the Lord has imposed it,
- 29 to put one's mouth to the dust (there may yet be hope),

2 Corinthians 8:7-15

- ⁷ Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.
- 8 I do not say this as a command, but I am, by mentioning the eagerness of others, testing the genuineness of your love. 9 For you know the

generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. 10 And in this matter I am giving my opinion: it is beneficial for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something. 11 Now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. 12 For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what one does not have. 13 For I do not mean that there should be relief for others and hardship for you, but it is a question of equality between 14 your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may also supply your need, in order that there may be equality. 15 As it is written,

"The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little."

Gospel Acclamation "Halle, Halle, Hallelujah" ELW 172

Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

The Gospel reading is found in the Gospel of Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

21 When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him, and he was by the sea. 22 Then one of the leaders of the synagogue, named Jairus, came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet 23 and pleaded with him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." 24 So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. 25 Now there was a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years. 26 She had endured much under many physicians and had spent all that she had, and she was no better but rather grew worse. 27 She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, 28 for she said, "If I but touch his cloak, I will be made well." 29 Immediately her flow of blood stopped, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. 30 Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my cloak?" 31 And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?' "32 He looked all around to see who had done it. 33 But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and

trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. 34 He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

35 While he was still speaking, some people came from the synagogue leader's house to say, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" 36 But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the synagogue leader, "Do not be afraid; only believe." 37 He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. 38 When they came to the synagogue leader's house, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. 39 When he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." 40 And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. 41 Taking her by the hand, he said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, get up!" 42 And immediately the girl stood up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. 43 He strictly ordered them that no one should know this and told them to give her something to eat.

Today's Psalm...

The psalmist describes a joy in God's healing that breaks into song, unable to remain silent, so that "my heart sings to you without ceasing" (Psalm 30:12). James Weldon Johnson's poem "The Gift to Sing" describes the kind of soul song that cannot be silenced by even the heaviest of sorrow. "With glad defiance in my throat," he writes, "I pierce the darkness with a note, and sing." The poem is a powerful complement to today's psalm.

The Gift to Sing

Sometimes the mist overhangs my path, And blackening clouds about me cling; But, oh, I have a magic way To turn the gloom to cheerful day— I softly sing.

And if the way grows darker still, Shadowed by Sorrow's somber wing, With glad defiance in my throat, I pierce the darkness with a note, And sing, and sing.

I brood not over the broken past, Nor dread whatever time may bring; No nights are dark, no days are long, While in my heart there swells a song, And I can sing.

Family Promise Update A community-based effort to help families experiencing homelessness

The **Shelter** located on Pacific Avenue Willmar is operating with a 3 person staff and 6 housing rooms that can sleep up to 4-5 people per room depending on make-up of the family. In addition, we have 3 rooms on the second level being made ready as soon as we can. Currently there are 13 host congregations providing meals 3 days a week as well as groceries for the other days of the week. All guests have been meeting with the case manager weekly to go over goals set, budgeting, job searching and housing.

Creation Care Tip
Reduce and Reuse – Recycling is
good; however, it is better to reduce
your use of plastics and reuse items.
Plastic is a petroleum product and increases our fossil fuel use. Only about
10% of plastics produced get recycled;
therefore, it is important to reduce our
use of them. Plastic bags can be recycled at Calvary. Following are ideas for
reducing the use of plastics:

- Use cloth bags at grocery stores and department stores
- Buy larger containers of items.
 Instead of single use (large container of yogurt vs. single serving size
- Buy refills instead of new bottles of soap, etc.
- Use refillable drinking glasses, coffee cups, etc.
