

The Seventh Weekend after Pentecost Saturday, July 6, 2024 5:30pm Sunday, July 7, 2024 9:00am "There is a Balm in Gilead" is a well-known African American spiritual about the power of Jesus to work in and through the lives of his followers despite our brokenness and shortcomings. Like today's reading and gospel, the hymn text reminds us that Jesus "fills in the gaps" in our ability, faith, and knowledge. Even humble acts of service—a listening ear, a shared meal, a kind word—bear witness to the Holy Spirit at work in the world around us!

Holy God, we thank you for the love you show for all of us, showing no partiality across cultures and races.

Give us good courage to remember that we are all your beloved children.

God of all, forgive us for our complacency. Forgive us for all of the times and places we have failed to welcome the stranger. Forgive us for the times where we prioritized our comfort over expanding our knowledge and advocacy.

Ignite our heart Lord, to remember that you are present in all who flee their homes and search for new opportunities.

God of Trinity, we remember that you sent Jesus to Earth not only to be with refugees, but as a refugee himself.

Forgive us for all of the ways we have individually and collectively fallen short to do this holy work of welcome.

God, we remember that you and your boundless love are not of this world. Remind us that it is not our job as Christians to cast judgment but to offer abundant and radical hospitality and love to all.

God, we acknowledge that walls and all earthly systems that work to separate us from one another are not your desire for your beloved people. Give us good courage to open our arms wide and strong in welcome and convict us to make real your kingdom of love, joy, grace, justice, and hospitality real here on Earth. Forgive us God, work through us and within us to share your love. Amen.

Oh God of welcome, we give you abundant thanks for our immigrant neighbors and community members. We celebrate all of the richness and diversity they bring to our world and to our communities and that you call them by name just as you call us by name. May our hospitality bring joy to not only those we work to welcome, but to us as well. Amen.

Scripture Readings Psalm 123

- 1 To you I lift up my eyes,
 - O you who are enthroned in the heavens!
- 2 As the eyes of servants

 look to the hand of their master,
 as the eyes of a maid
 to the hand of her mistress,

 so our eyes look to the Lord our God, until he has mercy upon us.
- 3 Have mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, for we have had more than enough of contempt.
- 4 Our soul has had more than its fill of the scorn of those who are at ease, of the contempt of the proud.

Here ends the reading of the Psalm.

2 Corinthians 12:2-10

2 I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. 3 And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows— 4 was caught up into paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. 5 On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. 6 But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, 7 even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. 8 Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, 9 but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. 10 Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ, for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

Gospel Mark 6:1-13

The Gospel reading is found in the Gospel of Mark Glory to you, O Lord.

He left that place and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. 2 On the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! 3 Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. 4 Then Jesus said to them, "Prophets are not without honor, except in their hometown and among their own kin and in their own house." 5 And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. 6 And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then he went about among the

villages teaching. 7 He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. 8 He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff: no bread, no bag, no money in their belts, 9 but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. 10 He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. 11 If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." 12 So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. 13 They cast out many demons and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in Almighty God, who guided the people in exile and in exodus, the God of foreigners and immigrants. I believe in Jesus Christ, a displaced Galilean, who was born away from his people and his home, who fled his country with his parents when his life was in danger.

When he returned to his own country he suffered under the oppression of Pontius Pilate. Jesus was persecuted, beaten, tortured, and unjustly condemned to death. But on the third day Jesus rose from the dead, not as a scorned foreigner but to offer us citizenship in God's kingdom.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the eternal immigrant from God's kingdom among us, who speaks all languages, lives in all countries, and reunites all races. I believe that the Church is the secure home for all believers. I believe that the communion of saints begins when we embrace all God's people in all their diversity. I believe in forgiveness, which makes us all equal before God, and in reconciliation, which heals our brokenness. I believe that in the Resurrection God will unite us as one people. I believe in life eternal, in which all will be citizens of the kingdom where God reigns forever and ever. Amen.

Family Promise Update A community-based effort to help families experiencing homelessness

The **Shelter** located on Pacific Avenue Willmar is operating with a 3 person staff and 6 housing rooms that can sleep up to 4-5 people per room depending on make-up of the family. In addition, we have 3 rooms on the second level being made ready as soon as we can. Currently there are 13 host congregations providing meals 3 days a week as well as groceries for the other days of the week. All guests have been meeting with the case manager weekly to go over goals set, budgeting, job searching and housing.
