18 Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." 19 So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air and brought them to the man to see what he would call them, and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. 20 The man gave names to all cattle and to the birds of the air and to every animal of the field, but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. 21 So the Lord God caused

a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. 22 And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. 23 Then the man said,

"This at last is bone of my bones

and flesh of my flesh;

this one shall be called Woman,

for out of Man this one was taken."

24 Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' 3 Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' 4 Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' 5 Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. 6 What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." 8 The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' 9 Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' 10 Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

11 'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. 12 If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 13 No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man 14 And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

16 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

17 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.





"If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:31-32)


Dear Friends in Christ,

What comes to mind when you hear the word disciple? For many of us the first image that comes to mind is the chosen twelve that Jesus called to follow him. But, we know that there were many more disciples than just the 12 who were the inner circle. Jesus called many to follow him and be his disciples. So, do you see yourself as a disciple?

What makes a disciple? Jesus called his disciples to follow, to teach, to heal, to pray, to love and serve one another, and to go out baptizing all nations, to name only a few of their tasks. Isn't this also our calling? Why does it seem so hard at times to live out our discipleship?

I think one of the key issues is in the word that has its root in disciple — and that is the word discipline. Jesus calls us to be disciplined in our proclamation of the word, in prayer, in healing, in forgiveness, in loving, in worship, in stewardship, in serving our neighbors, in taking care of our bodies, in teaching others about Jesus. We are called to be disciplined in our relationship with Jesus and our relationship with others. What God calls us to do is not easy. As humans we tend to balk at these disciplines. They may feel like a burden or that they may diminish our freedom. But it is only when we do adhere to these disciplines, hold to Jesus' teaching and respond to God's call, do we truly become free. The freedom we feel without the discipline of faith in Christ is not real freedom. We cannot know the Truth without following God's call, and without knowing the Truth we can never be truly free. So I invite you to try challenging yourself to be more disciplined in God's calling: pray, worship, forgive, sing, study, reach out, serve, teach, be a steward of God's creation and your bodies, be aware of those teaching moments and share God's love and grace with others, heal through love and forgiveness, and be in relationship with God and with all of God's children.
