As we enter the beautiful season of Advent, we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Advent is a time of waiting, hope, and reflection. This year, we draw inspiration from Luke 3:4, which says, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." Advent is the period of four weeks leading up to Christmas. It is a time when we remember the anticipation of Jesus' birth and look forward to His second coming. Each Sunday, we light a candle on the Advent wreath, symbolizing hope, peace, joy, and love. Advent Activities

Holy Communion Reminders...



*Wine and grape juice; bread or wafers and gluten free wafers are available at each communion station.

Family Promise of Kandiyohi County: A community-based effort to help families experiencing homelessness.

The **Shelter** located on Pacific Ave in Willmar is operating with a 3 person staff and 7 housing rooms that can sleep up to 4-5 people per room depending on make-up of the family. In addition, we have 2 rooms on the second level being made ready as soon as we can.

Currently there are 21 congregations providing financial, in- kind, housing sup-plies, groceries and 3 weekly meals.
