

Scripture Readings


I Corinthians 12:12-31a

12 For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

14 Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. 15 If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. 16 And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? 18 But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. 19 If all were a single member, where would the body be? 20 As it is, there are many members yet one body. 21 The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, 23 and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor. and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect, 24 whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, 25 that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. 26 If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. 27 Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. 28 And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. 29 Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work powerful deeds? 30 Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? 31 But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way. The word of the Lord.

The Gospel reading is found in the Gospel of Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

14 Then Jesus, in the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding region. 15 He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

16 When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,

because he has anointed me

to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives

20 And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. 21 Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." The Gospel of our Lord.

AV UPDATE



Dear Friends in Christ,

"I lift my eyes to the hills – from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." (Psalm 121:1-2)

Psalm 121 is a favorite of mine. It is a Psalm for sojourners...a Psalm for travelers. In this Psalm we hear a Hebrew poet crying out from a sense of fear and anxiety of what lies ahead in his journey. The psalmist is on a journey and is anxious and afraid of the unknown along the way. Sound familiar?

This Psalm about traveling, Psalm 121, reminds us in an interesting sort of way, that there are many people crying out for help amidst their life's journeys. Many suffer the loss of loved ones, depression, mental illness, physical disease, doubt, and separation from other people and from God. Wrestling with these daily crises on various levels, who of us would argue with the psalmist's question, "from where will my help come?" When we find ourselves sinking in the quicksand of some crisis, we do look up. We believe with the Hebrew poet that our deliverance is from above... "I lift my eyes to the hills." What we are saying is that God is with us in the midst of all that we are experiencing. To be sure, there are times when we think God has deserted us....that the hills are silent...and we too must cry, "from where will my help come?" This Psalm provides a word of strength and comfort for us. God is our helper...our creator...our keeper...our shade. Moreover, God is not only present in our crises to help, but as this Psalm of trust reassures us, God is with us every step of the way along our life's journey.

As a congregation, members of Calvary Lutheran Church are certainly on a journey together. Historically, Calvary has been a beacon of light and love in the Willmar community and beyond. Looking at the gallery of photos in Bethany Hall, we are reminded of the many women and men who have served as pastors along Calvary's journey. We are so very grateful for each and every one of them along this congregation's journey. Each has been a servant of God – preaching the Word, administrating the Sacraments, leading worship, teaching, visiting, and officiating at weddings, funerals and memorial services. We are grateful for Pastor Dwaine's time with us, and we wish him blessings and Godspeed in the next chapter of his life.

As we as a congregation lift our eyes to the hills...I invite us to pray this prayer... Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through joys and perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not always knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
