At a recent Calvary Church Council meeting, the Council unanimously adopted a Congregational Care-for-Creation Covenant.

The covenant is a commitment by our congregation to care for creation in five areas: worship, education, building and grounds, personal discipleship, and public witness.

- Worship: The congregation will incorporate creation-care themes into its worship services.
- Education: The congregation will educate its members about creation care.
- Building and Grounds: The congregation will make its buildings and grounds more environmentally friendly.
- Personal Discipleship: The congregation will encourage its members to adopt environmentally friendly practices in their personal lives.
- Public Witness: The congregation will advocate for creation care in the wider community.
