During this period of pastoral transition, we are taking intentional steps to prepare for the future. One step is ahead for all members as we ask you to participate in a congregation-wide assessment to help leadership understand the dynamics of this time and inform our future with a new pastor.

Beginning Saturday July 19th the online assessment called "CAT" Church Assessment Tool will be open to each and every person in the household age 16 and up. We have a goal of 307 people completing "CAT".

The results of "CAT" will provide helpful insight into the calling of a new pastor. Additionally, the assessment will provide us with a clear readout on the health of our congregation and where members want to see more energy invested.

Your participation in "CAT" will take only a handful of minutes and needs to be completed in one sitting.

Your responses are anonymous. No one will see your responses and know they are yours. If you lack online availability or need assistance, please contact the church office at 320-235-2508 and we will help you find a way to get the assessment completed.

We are confident your input into this important process will bear fruit for the future of our congregation. Please help us engage others in taking "CAT" starting July 19th.

This month will be an important month for Calvary, as we launch the Church Assessment Tool (C.A.T.) that will guide not only the Call Process for our new pastor, but also the leadership of Calvary in the months and years to come. We are also beginning a summer experiment to encourage folks to fill the front half of our beautiful sanctuary. You may not be aware, but a substantial number (approximately 137 households) worship on line in an average week. Now, the obvious best scenario, is to look ahead to the day when our sanctuary IS full, and I trust that this is in God's plans, but until then, we are going to rope of the back few rows of pews to encourage people to sit further forward. We will start this on Sunday, July 6th and continue through the summer. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Pastor Amy and I have been busy this summer coordinating with our Befrienders, our Home Communion folks and our Deaconesses to make certain that all members of Calvary that aren't able to attend worship are prayed for, cared for and communed on a monthly basis. Pastor Amy and I are also visiting with our people who have lost a spouse in the past year.
