The rich man also died and was buried. 23 In Hades, where he was being tormented, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. 24 He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames.' 25 But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things and Lazarus in like manner evil things, but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. 26 Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot

do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' 27 He said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house 28 for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' 29 Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' 30 He said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' 31 He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.' Transition Team Update

It is a pleasure to give you more results from the CAT Vital Signs Report this week.

The CAT starts with measuring the overall satisfaction in the congregation.

23% of members are clearly satisfied with how things are in the church.

55% are unsure if they are satisfied.

22% disagree they are satisfied.

The CAT identifies areas people focus on when assessing satisfaction with Calvary (for better or worse). There are five areas:

Worship – whether members believe services are exceptional in quality and spiritual content.

Ministry in Daily Life - whether Calvary helps members <u>discern the gifts God has given</u> them to employ in life.

Education - whether the church provides high quality educational opportunities for every stage of life.

Energy/Enthusiasm – whether members sense the spirit of Calvary inspires a high level of involvement.

Ministry in Daily Life – whether Calvary helps members <u>understand they are called to</u> ministries in their lives.

The data shows one-quarter of members are satisfied and nearly one-half are unsure if they are satisfied. Most members imagine a church with a higher level of vitality and are searching for a pathway that will lead them to sensing increased vitality in the church. Soon the Council and staff will be working on steps to begin an effort aimed at raising satisfaction based on clear evidence showing areas of most importance to members.

There is strong potential to improve the data in the Vital Signs report. This is based on the fact that one-half to two-thirds of our people are "On the fence" meaning they chose "tend to agree" or "tend to disagree" when answering questions throughout the CAT.

"On the fence" people are malleable. They are looking for reasons to be satisfied and to feel energy in the congregation. This is an asset because malleable people provide us with opportunities to make changes to begin increasing satisfaction and energy.

On September 28 your Church Council, pastors and Transition Team will be meeting at Green Lake Bible Camp for an afternoon retreat to begin creating "Reinvention Concrete Ideas" for Calvary's near future, all built upon the results of the Church Assessment Tool (C.A.T.)

Keep these leaders and Calvary Lutheran Church in your prayers as we continue moving forward.
