

All Saints' Day celebration has a long history in the worship life of the Christian Church. It began as a commemoration of the martyrs who had died for the faith, and it has since become a day when we honor and remember those who, in death, have joined the Church Triumphant, as well as the faithful saints of the present who serve Jesus Christ. Martin Luther held that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint--a sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus. Here at Calvary we will recognize and remember those members who have died since last All Saints' Day as we traditionally have- by reading their name, lighting a candle, and ringing a bell. This year we will also give all who are assembled for worship the opportunity to light a candle (taper or battery operated) in remembrance of others in their lives who have died and joined the great cloud of witnesses. After receiving Communion you will pass by a table with candles available. You may light a candle and sink it into the sand. If you would prefer not to light a candle but would rather turn on a battery operated one and place it on the table, that would be wonderful also. All ages are invited to participate in this celebration of the Saints.
