Purpose of Confirmation

Confirmation, otherwise known as Affirmation of Baptism, is an opportunity for young people to examine their faith, and respond to God's call for their life. This call of being a disciple does not begin, nor end, when youth are confirmed. Rather, the confirmation program at Calvary is designed to help young people to hear their call as disciples, as followers of Christ, and to learn how to live out their faith as a disciple of Christ.

It means that Confirmation is more than a class, it is more than a three year program – it is a ministry through which God is active in a student's life. Martin Luther taught that the hallmark of the Christian life is the practice of daily living out our baptismal covenant. Baptism is the foundation of our faith journey.

In baptism God's people make a covenant or promise

- To live among God's faithful people
- To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- To Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ through word and deed
- To serve all people following the example of Jesus
- To strive for justice and peace in all the earth

Confirmation is a time to practice living out these promises. Some ways we do this are through

- + Sharing in small groups
- + Participating in Worship
- + Praying
- + Participating in group discussions
- + Inviting friends to youth events or worship
- + Attending Sunday education hour
- + Serving at community meals
- + Serving at Lenten suppers
- + Writing worship notes
- + Studying scripture
- + Being a good friend

In the end, confirmation is about helping youth grow into the disciples of Jesus that they were created to be, equipping youth for a life of Christian living. By the grace of God, we continue – each and every day of our lives – to walk our journey of life with God. We look forward to being a part of this journey with you!

Confirmation Youth Expectations

- 1. Confirmation youth are expected to regularly attend weekly confirmation classes. If youth are ill and cannot attend class please call the church office. (235-2508) Each youth should bring the following each week:
 - a) 7-8th Grade Bible & a pen/pencil
 - b) 9th Grade Bible & Binder(provided)
- 2. Confirmation youth are expected to regularly attend Sunday worship and regularly participate in Holy Communion.
- 3. Confirmation youth are expected to take worship notes:
 - a) 8 Sunday worship notes. These notes are to be completed between September 10, 2017 and May 20, 2018.
 - b) **5** Mid-week Lenten worship notes. There are 8 services available to acquire these notes between Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. *These notes are taken instead of having class*.
- 4. Confirmation youth are expected to acolyte when scheduled. This is a yearlong service. Training happens each fall.
 - a) In the event of illness or if you have to be out of town, it is your responsibility to find a replacement. If you are changing with someone, please let the office know by Thursday. (235-2508)
- 5. Confirmation youth are expected to be involved in worship:
 - a) Choose **4** of the following: usher, greet, sound system, altar guild, Sat. communion assistant, reader, song leading team, or special music/musical ensemble (more info. on page 7)
- 6. Confirmation youth & a parent are expected to practice service by helping with the monthly Community Meal and Lenten Meal when assigned.
- 7. Confirmation youth are expected to attend the annual Confirmation Retreat for grades 7-9. This year's retreat will be held over President's Day Weekend, February 17-18, 2018.

Acolyte Schedule

- Acolyte scheduling is done online through 'Sign Up Genius'. You will receive an email upon being assigned to Acolyte and a reminder from 'Sign Up Genius' when it is your youth's turn to Acolyte.
- Thank you for taking your turn in serving as an acolyte and for making every effort to follow the schedule. Please be willing to fill in for each other as you are able. We count on your faithful service each week.
- 3. In the event of illness or if you have to be out of town, it is your responsibility to find a replacement. If you are changing with someone, please call the office by Thursday noon to let them know (235-2508) so that the names can be printed correctly in the bulletin. We will go by the schedule as printed.
- 4. Please remember that you are an important part of the worship. We are gathered in God's house and as His people we come to pray, praise, hear His Word, and receive what He gives through the Sacrament. We owe Him reverence and respect. Anything to distract from this worshipful reverence is disrespectful both to God and the worshipers around you. Acolytes are to conduct themselves always with courteous and reverent manner during the service.
- 5. Worship times are at 8:00 and 10:15. (Except where otherwise noted). Please be in the work room (connected to the church office) 10 minutes before the start of the service so that you can get robed and any special instructions for the day can be given. When you are robed, wait in the office until we proceed to the sanctuary.
