

**Macon Mayhem Dylan Denomme 2019-20 game worn jersey, size 54.**

Riverside, Ontario native Dylan Denomme played three years of college hockey with the before turning professional in 2017-18 with the Macon Mayhem. In his first pro season, Denomme played in 40 games for the Mayhem, including six playoff games, for a total of 28 points (13G, 15A) and 35 PIM. After spending his sophomore season in France, Denomme was signed by the Mayhem on January 7 for the remainder of the virus-shortened 2019-20 season, putting up 6 goals and 14 assists in 21 games for third place in team scoring. The front of this OT Sports white jersey has the embroidered primary logo sewn on the front. A small Viking helmet logo is screened onto the fabric in the neckline. On each shoulder are sewn on embroidered 5th anniversary logo patches. The numbers are sewn-on three color twill. The matching fabric nameplate has sewn on single color twill letters. Embroidered SPHL and OT Sports patches are sewn on at the bottom of the rear hemline. A silhouette of the state of Georgia is printed below the back neckline. The jerseys bear a strong resemblance to the jerseys worn by the Macon Whoopees during their one and only season in 1973-74. There is some game wear evident. I purchased this jersey directly from the player at the conclusion of the season.
