

Augusta Riverhawks Ryan Olidis 2010-11 game worn jersey, size 52.

Scarborough, Ontario native Ryan Olidis played four seasons in the Ontario Provincial Junior Hockey League and one season in the United States Hockey League before accepting a hockey scholarship at Niagara University. Olidis turned pro after graduation, playing 38 regular season games with the Riverhawks, scoring 12 goals with 15 assists. In nine playoff games, he had four goals and five assists. During the season, he was loaned to the Florida Everblades of the ECHL, appearing in two games. After his first pro season, Olidis went to Europe and played three seasons before retiring from professional hockey. This inaugural season blue and red Riverhawks jersey by OT Sports has the embroidered primary logo stitched to the front and two embroidered secondary logo patches on the shoulders. The embroidered SPHL logo appears at the base of the V neck. Since Olidis joined the team after the start of the season, the matching fabric nameplate with sewn on single color twill letters has been hastily and crudely added. This also explains the missing CINTAS sponsor patch from the front that was present on other player jerseys. The numbers are two color twill and the rear hem has a large embroidered Doctor's Hospital sponsor patch on white twill. The embroidered OT Sports logo patch and an embroidered SPHL patch also appear on opposite sides of the back hem. The jersey shows good game wear on the sleeves and back. I acquired it from an eBay auction.
