

Columbus River Dragons Seth Ensor 2020-21 game worn jersey, size 54.

Seth Ensor hails from Sugar Land, Texas and turned pro in 2019 after seven seasons of junior and college hockey. In his first professional season with the FPHL Danville Dashers, Ensor had 4 goals, 19 assists and 114 penalty minutes in 45 games. Ensor split his time in Danville between forward and defense. In May 2020, Ensor was acquired by Columbus in a four-player trade and was used primarily as a defenseman. Ensor only appeared in 11 games in the 2020-21 season, notching six assists and twenty-one penalty minutes. These red jerseys trimmed in black and teal from JOG Athletics were created to be worn for select home games during the COVID shortened season. It has the embroidered secondary logo sewn on the front. The numbers on the back and sleeves are three color sewn twill. The matching fabric nameplate has single color sewn twill letters. Just above the nameplate is a teal border that defines the black shoulder area that has sewn on embroidered primary and secondary team logos. The JOG logo is embroidered directly to the fabric above the nameplate. The jersey exhibits no game wear, but records indicate that Ensor only wore this jersey for one game on March 26 and during the post-game team celebration when the Dragons captured the FPHL Ignite Cup on April 30. I purchased the jersey directly from the team.
