Over the course of the 2013-14 season, the Gwinnett Gladiators played no less than thirteen different goaltenders. At the end of February, 2014, the Gladiators acquired Mark Guggenberger from the Alaska Aces. The Richfield, MN native began his professional career in the Central Hockey league where he was named Most Outstanding Goaltender and CHL Rookie of the Year. His arrival in Gwinnett brought a much needed stability to the position, and his 16 games played was the most of all the goalies on the roster that year. He was dubbed "the Guggenburglar" based on his stellar play during the final weeks of the season, leaving fans wondering about what might have been if the team played this well all season. Immediately following the Gladiators season, he received an emergency call up to the AHL Rochester Americans. In his AHL debut, he made 41 saves on 42 shots during regulation and overtime, and stopped 7 of 10 attempts in the shootout. This black CCM jersey is very similar to the SP jerseys the Gladiators wore for the previous ten seasons. The embroidered crest is centered on the front, along with the ubiquitous Kroger sponsor patch. Alternate logo patches are sewn on each shoulder. Embroidered CCM patches are sewn on below the neckline on both front and back. The player name in twill letters is sewn to a matching fabric nameplate. Two color sewn twill numbers are on the back and sleeves. Sewn on the back hem are the embroidered Meigray and ECHL patches. The jersey was purchased from an eBay auction.
