

**Atlanta Knights Mike Greenlay 1994-95 game worn jersey, size 58G.**

Mike Greenlay was the backup goaltender for J. C. Bergeron during the 1993-94 season. When Bergeron was called up to Tampa Bay at the end of the season, Greenlay stepped up and played spectacular hockey, and was the Knights goaltender for their playoff run to the Turner Cup. Greenlay posted an 11-1 playoff record, with a 2.32 GAA and a .910 save percentage. Greenlay only played in 20 games for the Knights in 94-95 so this jersey is in great condition. This home white jersey has a pair of Turner Cup Championship embroidered patches on each shoulder and the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary IHL embroidered patch on the right chest. In addition, there are embroidered Bauer and IHL patches on the back hem and a fight strap. When I purchased this jersey from Doug Reisinger at The Hockey Gallery, the jersey had the nameplate removed. Doug provided me with a couple of other Knights nameplates and I used them as a pattern to re-create the Greenlay sewn nameplate that is now on the jersey. It was the search to have this nameplate manufactured that led me to borrow a sewing machine and learn how to sew them myself. Upon retirement, Greenlay went on to a successful career as a television analyst for the NHL Minnesota Wild.
