

**Macon Whoopee Cosmo Clarke 1999-00 game worn jersey, size XXL-G .**

Cosmo Clarke played five seasons of professional hockey following college at Brock University. The 6'3" 235 lb. winger from Kanata, Ontario played twelve games for the Macon Whoopee during the 1999-00 season, his last pro season, before being dealt to the Memphis River Kings. After retiring, Clarke began coaching youth hockey in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area, a place he has called home since 1997 when he played for two consecutive seasons with the Ft. Worth Fire. This black OT Sports specialty jersey was worn for two consecutive home games on December 31 and January 1 when the Whoopee hosted their in-state rivals the Columbus Cottonmouths. A total of \$6700 was raised when the jerseys were auctioned off. It has the year 2000 printed around the main body, progressing from white at the bottom to gray near the top. An embroidered logo crest is heat pressed onto the front. The numbers consist of two color sewn twill, with the red twill screened with the word MILLENNIUM. A screened OT Sports 2000 logo patch is heat pressed to the rear hem. A smaller OT logo is printed on above the matching fabric nameplate, which consists of heat pressed vinyl letters. As with many specialty jerseys designed to be worn for just a couple of games, it shows extremely light wear. It was purchased from another collector.
