

Augusta Lynx Ryan Lang 2006-07 game worn jersey, size 56.

Saskatchewan native Ryan Lang played four years of college hockey at the University of Alaska-Fairbanks before turning pro with the Charlotte Checkers in 2004. Lang played the next two seasons in Augusta, including two call-ups to the AHL. During the 2006-07 season, Lang led the Lynx in scoring (25-48-73) in 61 games and was named to the ECHL All-Star Team. Over the next four seasons, Lang alternated between playing in Europe and the ECHL. This style of jersey was worn for four seasons between 2004-05 and 2007-08, with the only difference the presence or absence of sponsor patches and the ECHL 20th anniversary patch in '07-08. The front of this black Reebok lace-up jersey has the large lynx head four color logo and Reebok logo, as well as Lang's captain's C in two color sewn twill. The shoulders have twin lynx logos with the paw and puck, and the back has the Reebok logo just below the neck. The two color numbers and the nameplate are sewn twill. On the back hem are embroidered Meigray and ECHL logo patches. It shows good game wear, especially on the sleeves. It was purchased from another collector.
