

**Atlanta Thrashers Chris Thorburn 2007-08 game worn jersey, size 58.**

The new Reebok Edge jersey made its debut at the 2006-07 All-Star game and was later adopted by the NHL for the 2007-08 season. The Edge jerseys were tighter fitting than the previous CCM/Reebok 6100 series. This first jersey was known as the Edge 1.0 and was made with an Xtrafil material that was supposed to be more water repellent but the players found it also trapped perspiration, which ran down into their gloves and skates. The new Xtrafil fabric was also more prone to damage. Reebok quickly modified the Edge jersey, retaining the form fitting shape but replacing the shoulders, front panel and, on some jerseys, portions of the arms as well with the traditional Air Knit material. By mid-season, the Thrashers' set 2 jerseys were Edge 2.0. Originally drafted by Buffalo, he only played two games with the Sabres before being claimed off waivers by Pittsburgh. The Pens traded Thorburn to Atlanta for a third round draft pick in 2007, becoming a fixture on the team even after the franchise moved to Winnipeg. This set 3 away jersey has the embroidered primary logo sewn on the front, two color sewn twill numbers on the back and right sleeve and two color sewn letters on the nameplate. The Reebok logo patch is sewn above the nameplate. The embroidered NHL shield and the row of yellow arrows were moved to the neckline from their previous location on the bottom tail of the jersey. Since Atlanta was the host for the 2008 NHL All Star Game, the Thrashers also wore a commemorative patch on the upper right breast during the season. This jersey was purchased directly from Meigray.
