

Gwinnett Gladiators Cam Brown 2004-05 game worn jersey, size 54.

Richard Cameron “Cam” Brown played for a number of professional teams in five leagues during his fifteen-year professional career. Following the 2002-03 season as head coach of the Baton Rouge Kingfish, Gwinnett coach Jeff Pyle persuaded Brown to come out of retirement and join the Gladiators, where he officially ended his playing career after three seasons as the team’s captain. Brown also scored the first goal in Gwinnett’s very first game. He holds records for games played in the ECHL (789) and penalty minutes (2,425). He played in 13 ECHL seasons, scoring 206 goals and 499 points. In 2010, he was inducted into the ECHL Hall of Fame and was the first inductee into the Gladiators Hall of Fame. This black SP jersey from the first half has the large embroidered on twill Gladiator logo sewn on the front, with the smaller Gladiators wordmark logo sewn above it. Two alternate logo patches are found sewn on each shoulder. The embroidered Kroger sponsor patch is sewn on its usual upper right chest location. The two color twill numbers are sewn on, as is the matching nameplate with single colored twill letters. On the back hem the SP logo is embroidered to the jersey, but the Meigray and ECHL logos are embroidered patches. It was purchased from another collector.
