

Gwinnett Gladiators Brad Schell 2005-06 game worn jersey, size 54.

Brad Schell played six seasons with Gwinnett following four full years of junior hockey with the Spokane Chiefs. Drafted in the sixth round by the Atlanta Thrashers in 2002, the Saskatchewan native was second in team scoring with 79 points during 2005-06, his second pro season. In his third season, he was named captain of the American Conference in his first ECHL All-Star appearance in 2007. Schell led the team and the league that season with 85 assists and 110 points. He was called up to the AHL and played in 23 regular season games over three seasons and advanced to the AHL semi-finals with the Chicago Wolves in 2007, playing in 15 games. After his last season with Gwinnett in 2010, Schell went to play in Europe. As of this writing, Schell is surpassed only by Andy Brandt in number of games played for the Gladiators. This white SP jersey from the first half has the large embroidered on twill Gladiator logo sewn on the front, with the smaller Gladiators wordmark logo sewn above it. Two alternate logo patches are found sewn on each shoulder. The embroidered Kroger sponsor patch is sewn on its usual upper right chest location. The two color twill numbers are sewn on, as is the player nameplate and fight strap. On the back hem the SP logo is embroidered to the jersey, but the Meigray and ECHL logos are embroidered patches. It was purchased from another collector on eBay.
