

Augusta Riverhawks Brandon Foote 2012-13 game worn jersey, size 58G.

Ontario native Brandon Foote's one and only season of professional hockey was with the Augusta Riverhawks. Acquired late in February during the '12-13 season after four seasons in the Ontario Hockey League, Foote played in six games for the Riverhawks with a 3.64 GAA. Foote's dark blue Riverhawks jersey by OT Sports has the hawk head logo stitched to the front with two small wordmark embroidered logo patches sewn on each shoulder. The embroidered SPHL logo appears at the base of the V neck. The numbers are two color twill and the rear hem has a large Doctor's Hospital sponsor patch consisting of a screened logo on white twill. The OT Sports logo patch also appears on the back hem. There are light puck marks on the front crest and sleeves, and a large unrepaired tear just above the front hemline. This jersey was also worn earlier in the season by B. J. O'Brien, who was placed on waivers at the end of December. There is evidence of a larger nameplate removal, probably done by team staff, as the new letters were sewn using a meandering straight stitch. A professional would have used a zigzag stitch along the edge of these white twill letters to prevent the observed fraying. The jersey was acquired from the Macon Mayhem, the reincarnation of the Augusta Riverhawks, who were forced to relocate after Augusta officials refused to make needed repairs to the ice floor at Augusta's James Brown Arena.
