

Andy Sutton Easton Synergy game used hockey stick.

Following years of research and development, when the one-piece carbon-fiber Synergy was rolled out around 2000, it was the lightest, strongest, and most reliable hockey stick ever made. Made from carbon fiber and resin, there is no seam where the blade meets the shaft, resulting in a stiffer stick with a lower flex point. After it was introduced, many NHL players and goalies stated that they observed a noticeable increase in the speed of the shots taken with the Synergy. I purchased it on eBay from a gentleman who stated an Atlanta Thrashers equipment staffer gave it to his daughter following a game they attended. Photos of Sutton taken during the 2003-04 season suggest the markings on this particular stick are consistent with the one he was using during that season. The blade on this stick is cracked, making it more likely that it would have been given to a fan. It is a good compliment to my Andy Sutton '03-04 pre-season game worn jersey.
