

Columbus Cottonmouths Greg Beller 2011-12 game worn jersey, size 54.

Drafted by New York Rangers in round 6 of the 2005 NHL Entry Draft, Rainy River, Ontario native Greg Beller played college hockey at Yale and the University of Manitoba before his only pro season in 2011-12. Originally signed by the ECHL Idaho Steelheads on August 29, 2011, Beller was released before the start of the season and was picked up by the Augusta Riverhawks. Beller played in only one game for Augusta before he was released in early November. He signed with Columbus and suffered a broken jaw in his first game. Despite missing 15 games, Beller scored 16 goals with 20 assists in 33 games for the Cottonmouths. Beller was Columbus' leading scorer in the playoffs with 5 goals and 5 assists in six games as the Cottonmouths won the SPHL championship. Beller was named to the SPHL All-Rookie Team but retired from professional hockey at the conclusion of the season. The front of this OT Sports jersey has the embroidered sewn on snake head logo along with a sewn on embroidered Hughston Clinic sponsor patch. The neck has a sewn on embroidered SPHL logo patch and the back and sleeves have sewn on two color twill numbers. On the shoulders are sewn on embroidered alternate logo patches. On the back is a sewn on embroidered SPHL patch and a sewn on embroidered OT Sports logo patch. The matching cloth nameplate has the player's name in single color sewn twill. There is some great game wear, including what looks like a skate cut across the number 1 on the left sleeve. Beller's autograph is on the top of the number 12 on the rear. I purchased this from another collector.
