Following his year in Macon, Wilson settled in Columbus, working for the Columbus Fire Department and skating with the Snakes as needed when players were injured or on suspension. This red alternate jersey manufactured by OT Sports has the embroidered Trax alternate logo sewn on the front, two alternate logo patches sewn onto each shoulder and the sewn player nameplate with single color twill letters on the back. Player numbers are in two color sewn twill. I purchased the jersey with only the front logo from an eBay seller, who had acquired some dead stock from OT Sports. Over the years, I acquired the two shoulder patches from another source and added the numbers and nameplate myself according to team specifications.
