Zakiyah raised her hand to answer. "A protest is a public expression of **dissent** toward an idea or action."

"That's correct Zakiyah," Mr. Carr responded. Then he wrote the words "no justice, no peace" on his whiteboard and showed it to the class. "What do you think these words mean?"

Jahari raised his hand. "I think 'no justice, no peace' means if you use power to support the unfair treatment of people they will rebel and fight back."

"That's a very good insight Jahari. Do you all agree with what Jahari said?" asked Mr. Carr. After the class expressed **concurrence** with Jahari's answer, Mr. Carr asked the class to write what they think happens when there is no justice and no peace. Everyone wrote their answer and held up their boards. Mr. Carr called out some of the answers. "Wow! It looks like you all have been watching the news. I see riots, marches in the streets, Black Lives Matter plaza, police killing people, people killing police, tearing down statues and racism." Then Mr. Carr asked everyone to erase their whiteboards as he erased

his whiteboard and wrote the words "know justice, know peace." He showed his whiteboard to the class and asked, "How does the message change with these words?"

Nevaeh was the first to raise her hand to respond. "I think this message says if you are aware of the truth about the way people are treated, and your actions show you are doing your best to make sure they are treated fairly, there will be less conflict and people will get along with each other."

"I agree with Nevaeh. Do you all agree as well?" asked Mr. Carr. After the class expressed concurrence again, Mr. Carr asked them to write what they think happens when people understand this message. The class wrote things like clean water in Flint, non-violence, equal pay, pride, love and affordable homes. Mr. Carr was encouraged about the future because he could see his students' hope for the world to be a better place.
