

2 Samuel 7:4-17

When we think of building a home, we think of building a big strong fancy structure filled with everything that makes us happy. In a home that serves the Lord, it should be a place filled with love, peace, comfort and safety. David desired to build a house for the Lord, but the Lord had other plans for David. In the book of 2 Samuel 7:11b, the Lord promises David that one day he will have an empire or house. However, God's plan for David's descendants is greater than the plan He had for David. God made a promise that after David dies, one of his children will become king and build a temple or house. The house will not have four walls. This house will be a dynasty. God will make his kingdom strong forever, and his rule will last forever through his family's descendants.


