

#### Lesson 4

Leviticus 1:3-13

[Teacher's Note: Please be prepared to address the concern some children may have about animals being used for an offering. If necessary, remind children that the animals were not alive.]

God tells the Israelites about a special kind of offering called a "burnt offering." A perfect animal like a cow, sheep or goat was brought to the altar and the whole animal was burned. The Israelites gave their best by offering a healthy animal without any blemishes. A person would lay their hands on the animal's head, which symbolized taking responsibility for their actions and moving their sins to the animal. It was a way of showing complete devotion to God by asking God to forgive them for their sins. The Bible tells us that the burned animal created a "sweet aroma," which meant that God was pleased with their sacrifice.

Just as the Israelites brought their best animal to God, we can show our love and gratitude to God by offering Him our best





