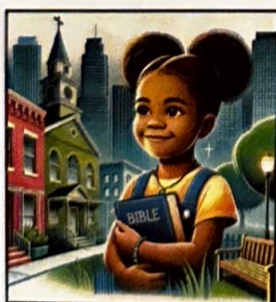

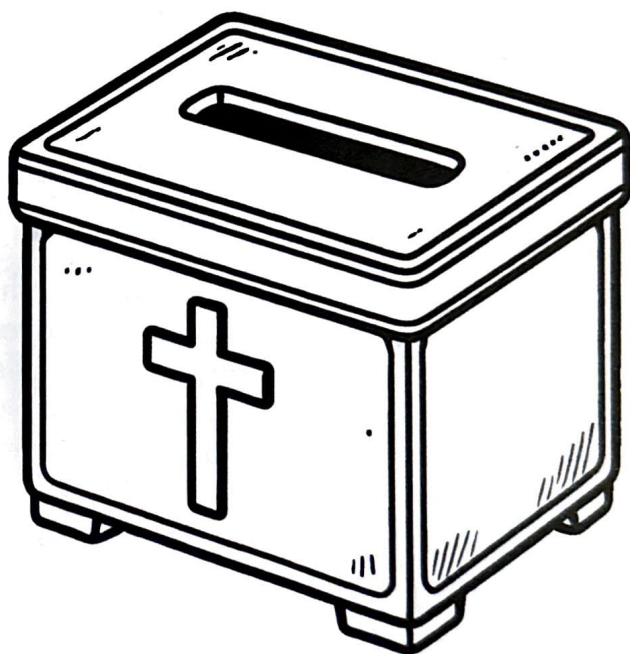
Help the Faithful Five make an "My Offering to God" Box.
