- Read Leviticus 1:5-9. A) Give the biblical definition of "sacrifice", tell how it applies here. B) What was the role of the Priest during this sacrificial rite?
  C) What type of sacrifice does God expect from his children today?
  D) What personal sacrifices may be necessary to restore relationships between friends and family today?
- 3. Read Leviticus 1:10-13. A) Describe the general environment of these "sacrificial rites" (the site, animals, sounds, odor, bloodshed, burning flesh....) give your opinion, why? B) How is this a "Sweet-Pleasing odor"? C) Earlier we gave the definition of "sacrifice" now give the purpose as related to fellowship with God. D) In your opinion what would be the steps necessary in restoring our broken relationship with God?
- 4. Read Leviticus 1:14-17. A) Give the definition of "Holiness" explain how it is applied here. B) How can we be "Holy"? C) On p. 22; explain how we can daily: "pull a weed and plant a seed". D) Read and relate the song: "Is Your All on The Altar?" by E. A. Hoffman.
