And to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?

*For he grew up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of dry ground:*

*He had no form nor comeliness; and when we see him*

*There is no beauty that we should desire him.*

He was despised and rejected of men;

A man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief:

*And as one from whom men hide their face he was despised,*

*And we esteemed him not.*

Surely he hath borne griefs inflicted by us, and suffered sorrows we have caused:

Yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded through our transgressions, bruised through our iniquities:

The chastisement of our peace was upon him,

And with his wounds we were healed.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way;

And the Lord hath caused the iniquity of us all to fall upon him.

He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth:
