Readers will have to watch out for the strong language, sex, violence, self-harm, abuse, and drugs present in the story. Some readers may find Hutchinson's book to be too long, but you might miss out on the twists and turns of the story. At the Edge of the Universe may contain many negative elements, but I enjoyed the story despite them. For these reasons, I would suggest this book to anyone 14 years or older. The book would make a great gift for fans of LGBTQ stories and/or coming of age stories.
