The way Wallenfels creates these two completely unrelated stories keeps readers hooked because we're constantly trying to figure out what these two characters from different ends of the west coast have to do with each other. Furthermore, Josh's cabin fever becomes extremely relatable to all teens who feel like being stuck at home during this COVID-19 pandemic is a true test of their strength and patience.

This novel is amazing. It has a fairly unpredictable plot which really makes the story suck in its readers.
