Sophie Foster is 13 years old and getting ready to start her first full year at Foxfire. She is finally feeling at home with Edaline and Grady, who have adopted her. One day while out with Grady she finds an Alicorn, which is a sparkly winged unicorn. This is a special find because only one other Alicorn has ever been found. Sophie is given the task of rehabilitating the Alicorn so she can join the other animals in the Sanctuary. Sophie names the Alicorn Silveny and finds out that Silveny can transmit messages and images into her head.

As Sophie begins school, she is beginning to have problems that the doctor cannot seem to fix. Some of the council members think she may be defective. Sophie has started receiving messages from the Black Swan. She is approached by Alden and asked to join him on a secret mission to Exile where prisoners are held. While on the mission Alden's mind is broken. She wants to help Alden, but her special talents seem to be failing her.
