This novel is about four kids, Milly, Michael, Jason and Jess who recently have moved from London to a town in the countryside. They have also recently become stepsiblings but do not like each other very well. Their parents have decided to start a book store business, so their father purchases many books.

Since it is summer break, the kids do not have anything to do in this small town. Milly and Jason are very bored, so they decide to look through the books that their father has bought. One book that catches their attention is *The Genie Handbook: Grant Wishes like an Expert in Six Easy Steps*. They pick up the book and look inside.
