Marjorie and Marty become the first females to work the floor in Tiffany and get swept into the whirlwind of the fabulous New York lifestyle during all the excitement of the end of WWII. Through all these experiences, Marjorie not only makes millions of memories, but also discovers a truth about herself. Though Marjorie enjoys living the glamorous life, she will always return home to her family with whom her heart remains faithful.
