#### INTERNATIONAL STUDIES AND PROGRAMS

The programs listed below are filtered through the International Studies and Program unit on campus. Many of these awards listed below are affiliated with other centers on campus as well, so you may see a little overlap in this section with those above.

# • African Studies Center

The African Studies Center provides support for African research, forging international partnerships, conference attendance, and more.

- Travel Funding for Africanist Students
- The African Studies Center has limited funds available to assist students with travel expenses related to research and presenting at scholarly conferences. These funds will provide partial support of travel costs. The applicant's college, department, and other sources will be expected to share the costs of travel expenses.
- Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships
- Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships are awarded to students enrolled in a program that combines the study of a modern foreign language with advanced training in international development studies or in the international development aspects of professional or other fields of study.

# o The Nnamdi Azikiwe International African Student Fellowship

- The African Studies Center is pleased to announce the Nnamdi Azikiwe International African Student Fellowship! A fellowship of up to \$2,000 to support international African students travel to Africa for research. The award honors former Nigerian President Nnamdi Azikiwe, a scholar and politician, who led Nigeria as its first civilian president and who invited MSU faculty to join him and other Nigerians to build a land-grant model university in Eastern Nigeria. This became the University of Nigeria at Nsukka, had a distinguished educational history, and was the beginnings of the MSU African Studies faculty, now approximately 100 scholars spanning many colleges and departments.
- The Roger Meece Award
- The Meece Graduate and Undergraduate Awards are established to honor Mr. Roger Meece's unwavering dedication to diplomacy and peacekeeping and to encourage excellence in African Studies

# • Asian Studies Center

The Asian Studies Center can help connect students to scholarships and awards that support their studies, research, and work in Asian language and culture.

- Kichu & Moon Scholarships
- The Richard Kichu & Joan Sojeon Moon Scholarships are awarded by the Council on Korean Studies at the Asian Studies Center. Recipients are selected based on academic performance and financial need with special consideration given to students who promoted an understanding of Korean culture through participation in community service, extracurricular or other activities.
- David Cho Scholarship
- The David Cho Scholarships are awarded by the Council on Korean Studies Center at the Asian Studies Center. Recipients are selected based on academic performance and financial need. Special consideration will be given to students who promote an understanding of Korean culture and students that are U.S. veterans, ROTC members, and/or active members of the military.

# • <u>Center for European, Russian and Eurasian Studies McCagg Memorial</u> Student Paper Contest

This essay contest for undergraduate and graduate students focuses on papers which contain a significant European, Russian or Eurasian component.

# • Center for Gender in Global Context (GenCen)

GenCen offers a variety of funding opportunities for graduate students including GJEC and WGS dissertation fellowships, student travel funding for conferences and research, PhD instructors for summer WS courses, and student paper and activism competitions.

- Graduate Student Travel Funding
- GenCen awards travel grants on a rolling basis for graduate students. The grants fall into two categories: Conference Presentations and Research. Conference Presentations grants of up to \$300 will be awarded to support graduate students who will be delivering papers or other presentations on research related to women's and gender studies at academic conferences. Research travel grants of up to \$500 will be awarded to graduate students whose major research focus is women's and gender studies. These funds will be used to support travel to engage in preliminary exploratory research in advance of writing a dissertation grant proposal.
- o Annual Paper Competition

 Graduate students are encouraged to submit a paper for the Rita S. Gallin Award for the Best Graduate Paper on Women and Gender in Global Perspective. Papers should focus on issues related to women, gender, international development, and globalization, and the awarded author(s) receive a \$250 prize.

# o GJEC Dissertation Fellowships

o In conjunction with the Graduate School, our GJEC program sponsors up to 6 dissertation fellowships annually (for up to \$10,000). There are two categories of fellowships: Research and Completion. Research fellowships are for Ph.D. students at MSU who have completed all requirements for their degree with the exception of their dissertation research, and Completion fellowships are for those who have completed everything except their dissertation.

# • <u>Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies Graduate Student Research</u> Grants

CLACS Graduate Student Research Grants are available to support work in other countries in Latin America and the Caribbean funded by the CLACS endowment.

#### o Tinker Field Research Grant

o to support graduate student predissertation research in Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking Latin American countries. CLACS Graduate Student Research Grants are available to support work in other countries in Latin America and the Caribbean funded by the CLACS Endowment. These funds enable students to select field research sites, establish relationships with community members, pilot research methods, and make contacts with local scholars working on related issues.

# • Claffey Meyer International Travel Grant (DOCUMENT)

This award provides financial assistance to domestic students who intend to travel to developing countries for the purpose of providing technical assistance, participate in research, or engage in service. The intent is for students to work towards discovering and implementing solutions in response to urgent human needs (for example: food security, environmental quality, health and nutrition, education, and other areas) and, thereby, to encourage careers in international development teaching, research and practice. Grants are intended to support travel, related living expenses, and projects costs, not to be used as a tuition scholarship.

• <u>Fulbright Grants</u> (Previously listed in other areas of this document) Graduate grants for international study and research.

# • Dr. Charles and Marjorie Gliozzo Dissertation Research Scholarship

This scholarship is available to MSU doctoral students with dissertation research objectives who have defended, or are in the process of defending, a dissertation proposal. The scholarship supports field research abroad in support of the student's dissertation.

# • <u>Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS)</u> (Previously listed in other areas of this document)

Fellowships for graduate and undergraduate studies in African languages and area studies are available through the African Studies Center, provided by a grant from the U.S. Department of Education.

# • Graduate Student International Travel Grant (GSITG)

ISP offers small travel grants to graduate students at MSU who are engaged in research that deals with international issues. The Graduate Student International Travel Grant (formerly the Global Young Scholars Grant) provides funding for graduate students to present papers with an international focus at international professional conferences at international locations. For more information, see the Graduate School Funding Guide.

# Graduate Travel Funding

Funds from the Graduate School are available for graduate and graduate professional students to travel to present their research at professional conferences. These funds are not available to support thesis/dissertation research projects or course work. This funding is only for graduate students pursuing a degree program.

#### • Lillian Kumata Scholarship Program

The Lillian Kumata Scholarship Program offers a limited number of need-based, partial tuition scholarships to the MSU international students and scholars and their spouses for the fall and spring semesters, up to \$2,500.

#### • Muslim Studies Center Graduate Student Essay Award

This award recognizes an outstanding research paper by a current MSU graduate student whose studies focus on Muslims in any contexts and/or Muslim-majority communities/societies.

## • Office of International Students and Scholars Grants and Scholarships

MSU offers a limited number of grants, scholarships and loans for international students. Loan and grant programs are either short term or to be used as degree completion loans.

Michigan State University has joined the Institute for <u>International Education Syria</u> <u>Consortium for Higher Education in Crisis</u>, which provides Syrian students the opportunity to continue or begin their academic studies.

# • Traveling Scholar Program (for Ph.D. candidates only)

The Traveling Scholar Program enables doctoral-level students at any CIC university to take advantage of educational opportunities--specialized courses, unique library collections, unusual laboratories--at any other CIC university without change in registration or increase in tuition.

#### Walker Hill Scholarship

An award for an MSU doctoral student at pre-dissertation stage who has completed adequate credits to have pre-dissertation research objectives. Description, appropriateness and feasibility of pre-dissertation research objectives to be accomplished during the period spent abroad. Financial need may be considered, previous recipients of a Walker Hill award or an ISP Predissertation Travel Award are not eligible. To be used for pre-dissertation visits to the site of the doctoral research in a country outside the United States (for international students, research in one's own country does not qualify).

#### • Whittier Endowed International Health Scholarship Fund

This scholarship is available to MSU graduate students (Master's or Ph.D. level) or MSU professional students who are in the either the College of Human Medicine or

the College of Osteopathic Medicine. It is meant to fund international health research (graduate level) or approved international health clerkships (4-6 week duration) for third or fourth year medical students.
