Sweet Potato Casserole by Vicky Jones

INGREDIENCE

- ♦ 2 large sweet potatoes
- ♦ 3 Tbsp. butter
- ♦ 2 Tbsp. 1/2 and 1/2 cream
- ♦ Salt to taste

PECAN TOPPING

- ♦ 1/2 cup brown sugar
- ♦ 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- ♦ 1 cup pecans, chopped
- ♦ 1/3 cup butter

DIRECTIONS

- ♦ Baked sweet potatoes at 350°F until very tender (approx.. 60 minutes)
- Let potatoes cool, then peel and mashed (makes about 3-4 cups)
- Add the butter, cream and salt.
- ♦ Place them in 3-4 ramekins or one larger dish.

PECAN TOPPING

- Mix the brown sugar, flour and butter together until crumbly, add the pecans and place on top of sweet potato.
- ♦ Bake at 350F for 20min. or until the edges are bubbling and the topping lightly browned.

• Serve immediately.

Cheesy Asparagus by Sherry Suggs

Ingredients:

1 ½ pounds fresh asparagus, trimmed

1/3 cup heavy cream or milk

2 cloves of garlic minced

½ teaspoon ground pepper

½ teaspoon salt

1 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

1/4 cup finely grated Parmesan cheese

½ teaspoon crushed red pepper

Directions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F

Arrange asparagus in a 9 by 13 baking dish.

Combine cream, garlic, pepper, and salt in a small bowl: drizzle over the asparagus.

Sprinkle mozzarella, Parmesan and crushed red pepper evenly over the asparagus.

Bake until the cheese is golden and melted and the asparagus is tender, about 20 minutes.

Serve immediately.

Ingredients

- 16 oz box Vanilla Wafer Cookies
- 4 cups whole pecans
- · 2 Tablespoons honey
- 1/2 cup good quality Bourbon
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar, for rolling

Instructions

- In a food processor fitted with with the knife blade, process vanilla wafer cookies until they are a fine crumb. Remove to a large mixing bowl
- Add pecans and process as finely as possible.This will be a fine chop. Stir into vanilla wafers.
- 3. In a measuring cup combine honey and bourbon and stir together.
- 4. Drizzle bourbon mixture over the cookie and nuts and mix together until well combined.
- 5. Use a 1" cookie scoop to scoop out dough. Roll into balls in the palm of your hands.
- 6. Roll in powdered sugar or cocoa powder and place on a lined cookie sheet
- 7. Store in an airtight container with a lid in the refrigerator until ready to serve.

Head to the dollar store and pick up a collection of wine glasses, artificial snow and a few kitschy holiday figurines — or even plastic ornaments — for making these easy holiday dioramas. The finished decorations look lovely adorning your holiday table or mantel topped with dollar-store candles.

Supplies

- Wine glasses in various size
- Cardboard
- Pen
- Scissors
- Hot glue gun
- Small plastic trees, figurines, or ornaments
- Artificial Snow
- Superfine silver glitter (optional)
- Ribbon or string
- Candles



Directions

- 1) Create the base for the dioramas by placing the glasses upside down on cardboard and tracing around the outside edge. To make one for your young friend, cut a clear plastic bottle in half, and use the bottom end just like the wine glass. Cut out the rounds.
- 2) Fire up your hot glue gun, and start arranging any small figurines or decorations. You can even pop in a few glittering plastic animals for a sparkling diorama.
- 3) Once the glue has dried, place the wine glass or bottom of the plastic bottle over the base to make sure everything fits. Now remove the base, flip over the wine glass or plastic bottle, and pour around one-fourth cup of snow into the glass. Add a sprinkle of glitter for a sparkling touch.
- 4) Replace the base of the diorama, nestling the glued figurines into the snow until the base is level with the edge of the glass. Secure with hot glue.
- 5) Finish with a length of ribbon or twine for a cute look. Flip, place on a charger, and enjoy the cute snow-filled diorama. If using wine glasses, top with candles, and you're ready to decorate.
- 6) Enjoy on your holiday table, on a mantel, or scattered around your home for a fun, festive look! And your plastic diorama is safe for any youngster to shake and enjoy over and over.
