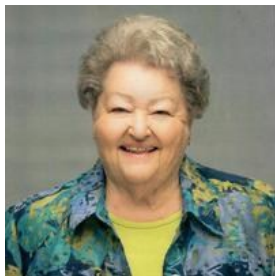
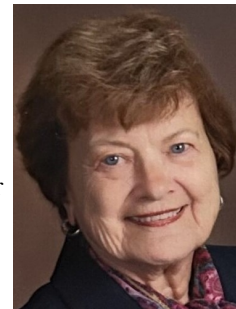

In May, Kim Bagby was home for two months and was able to attend our meetings. Kim held a Derby Party at her house. We had a great

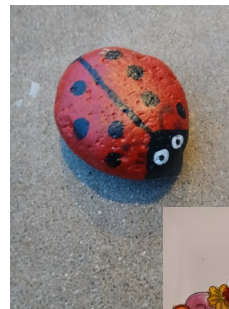
time!

How to Remain Non-Profit?

- > All entities MUST pay IC Council dues. Entities are: Chapters, District Councils, Regional Councils, State Councils, and any other Zone or Auxiliary.
> All entities MUST submit a Tax-Form (Tax Facts) to Headquarters each year by September 15th.
> All individual ESA members MUST pay individual member dues.

If these three (3) items are NOT completed, then the entity is NOT considered Non-Profit

What Do I Owe and Where Do I Send It?

- > Individual Member dues are sent to ESA Headquarters. Each member will receive a bill in the mail. These are paid yearly during the month you pledged. Dues are \$59 (unless you are a senior or a Life-Active Member).
> IC Council dues are due at the beginning of the ESA Year (August 1st) and must be paid before May 1st to be considered in "good standing" and receive voting privileges at IC Convention. These dues are mailed to the current IC Treasurer. DO NOT SEND TO ESA HEADQUARTERS.

## No-Bake Peanut Butter Chex Bars by Sarah Brekke (Submitted by Laurie Mulroony)

If you are a chocolate-peanut butter fan, these no-bake Chex bars are for you!

### Ingredients

- 3/4 cup honey
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/4 cups creamy peanut butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 6 cups crispy rice cereal squares, such as Chex®
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1/3 cup creamy peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons butter

### Directions

1. Gather all ingredients. Line a 9x13-inch baking pan with foil and lightly coat with nonstick cooking spray.
2. Combine honey and sugar in a 4-to 6-quart Dutch oven. Heat over medium heat just until the mixture begins to boil, stirring frequently. Stir in 1 1/4 cups peanut butter and salt until fully combined.
3. Add cereal to the pot and stir until evenly coated.
4. Transfer mixture to the prepared pan, spreading and packing in an even layer. Set aside to cool.
5. Meanwhile, combine chocolate chips, 1/3 cup peanut butter, and butter in a medium microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on high until fully melted, 1 to 1 1/2 minutes, stirring every 30 seconds.
6. Pour chocolate mixture over the bars, spreading evenly. Chill bars until topping is set, 1 hour.
7. Use foil to remove bars from the pan before cutting and serving.



## Honey Lime Basil Peach Fruit Salad by Ambitious Kitchen (Submitted by Vicky Jones)

Gorgeous honey lime basil peach fruit salad made with fresh peaches, blackberries, blueberries and pomegranate. This summer peach fruit salad recipe is lightly tossed with honey, lime juice and fresh basil leaves for a fresh summer side dish that's perfect for bbq's and parties!

### Ingredients

- ◆ 4 large ripe (but not too ripe) yellow peaches, sliced
- ◆ 1 cup blackberries
- ◆ 3/4 cup blueberries
- ◆ Seeds from 1 medium pomegranate
- ◆ 6 large basil leaves, cut into ribbons
- ◆ 1-2 teaspoons honey
- ◆ 1/2 lime, juiced

### Directions

1. Add peaches, blackberries, blueberries, pomegranate seeds, and basil leaves to a large bowl.
2. Drizzle honey and lime juice
3. Toss with tongs.

Serves 6



## Isn't That Crafty! - How to Upcycle Cardboard Boxes

With a few supplies, you can easily upcycle cardboard boxes and make beautiful custom storage and organizing boxes for your home.

### Gather these Supplies

- Empty cardboard boxes
- Razor blade
- Scissors
- Fabric
- Spray adhesive
- Hot glue and gun
- Basketry sea grass or wide jute twine



### Step by Step Directions

1. Select your cardboard boxes. I used empty boxes from some new food storage containers. They were just the right size for some of my shelves.
2. Carefully cut off the tops and flaps from the boxes.
3. Start thinking about a fabric. Measure the boxes, and buy an appropriate amount. I needed about 1.5 yards for these two. Iron your fabric if it is wrinkled.
4. Start by spraying the bottom of the box with spray adhesive. Then place the box in the center of the fabric.
5. Identify the "short sides" and the "long sides" of the cardboard boxes. Spray the long sides with adhesive and smooth the fabric up those two sides.
6. Cut out a "square" of fabric from the short ends.



7. Fold over the edges to make seams. Spray the box ends with adhesive, and smooth the fabric up each side of the box.

8. Next, grab your coil of sea grass or twine. Wrap the sea grass around the box one time (about 1 inch from the top) and secure with hot glue. Wrap the sea grass 7 more times. Secure the edges with hot glue.
9. Viola! You have some beautiful DIY fabric boxes!
