Boy, so far so good for this storm season. Our thoughts and prayers are with all those folks north of us on the east coast. We need to keep our fingers crossed for our park for the rest of the season.

As of this date we are moving forward with the transition to the new Spectrum Agreement as planned. Just as a reminder all shareholder residents of Spanish Trails West will see a monthly fee increase from the current \$123.00 per month to the new \$142.00 per month. Non-Share Holders will see a fee increase from the current \$23.00 a month to \$42.00 a month.

1. This fee increase will be effective October 1, 2018 and will enable us to provide these services for the length of the agreement with no additional fee increases over the contract term.
2. With this agreement:
 - a. Every home in the park will be entitled two HD Boxes at **NO** additional monthly fee.
 - b. Every home in the park will receive 100 meg Internet at **NO** additional monthly fee.
 - c. Every home in the park will be entitled to a modem/router at **NO** additional monthly fee.
 - d. Every home in the park will receive approximately 200 HD Television Channels at **NO** additional monthly fee.
 - e. NOTE: In the event you already have this equipment in place in your home you will not need to take any action.
 - f. This will result in a billing adjustment. Since Spectrum bills one month in

advance you will need to verify with them to ensure your bill has been updated effective October 1.

Going forward all equipment being provided by Spectrum will remain their property. This includes recording devices, telephone service etc. which residents may order in addition to the services negotiated with the new bulk agreement. We have been told that more detailed information regarding billing adjustments, equipment returns etc. will be forth coming by the end of September. Channel line-up for the service offerings included in this agreement are now available in the office. We appreciated your patience and support.

In addition to television and internet concerns, work continues for other items of interest/concern in the park. Bids were received from three vendors to either repair or replace our existing fountains. Repair of the fountain which is not working as well as the overall all status of the fountains will be on the agenda for the next board meeting.

As if this is not enough, board members continue to work to resolve concerns with the mowing crew and the pool. First, thank you everyone for your patience with the mowing. Heavy rain continues to cause the grass to grow quickly. This combined with issues associated with mowing crew errors has proven to be a challenge. We are working with the vendor to keep concerns at a minimum.

Finally, we need your help with pool concerns. We have reports of people using the pool with open wounds, bowel problems and using the rest rooms without first drying off. All of these are serious concerns which cannot continue. Any open wound or bowel

release in the pool has the potential for the state to test and shut down our pool. Additionally, not drying and walking on linoleum can cause a serious slip and fall accident. If you are experiencing any of these concerns, please be considerate of others as well as yourself and refrain from using the pool until such time that they are resolved.

Lastly, we can't thank Peggy Foote enough for her help and support with keeping our office open. Peggy has continued to work with us in the office through the summer. We may be hiring a temporary person to work part time to fill in for Peggy soon. Please give Peggy a big thank you when you see her.
