Both girls did very well this last semester in school, which is a huge praise. They are BACK again after suffering the tragic loss of their sister in January 2021. Even though the pain continues, they are each learning how to deal with loss in positive ways which takes a lot of work.

Joselin has learned to work on stress in her life after learning that stress can and did cause her much pain and anxiety. She is doing well and learning scriptures that deal with whatever emotion she is working on.

The successes of the last semester helped teach her about resilience and strength that she did not know she had. Joselin lacks 1.5 years to graduate.

Adela rejoined the program in January 2021 and was able to complete the 8th grade in October. This was a major victory for her. School has always been a challenge.

Last year she was in a modified home school program and was able to receive extra help from one of the teachers. This year she is in the same program and will be doing 9th and 10th grade which will allow her to finish high school.

This is important because it will allow her to go to technical school and study some form of culinary arts. Without the high school diploma, she cannot enter any technical school. Adela did marry in July 2021 and seems to be very happy and stable. She has an 8 year-old son from a previous relationship and he is benefiting from the stable home. She has committed to no more children until she finishes school. We had that discussion with her before agreeing to help her with school for this year.

We asked Deisy to write about herself and this is her response in her own words.

Hello my name is Deisy Ical, I'm 26 years old. I'm studying to be an English translator; this major is for four and a half years. I have completed already two years and half. I have two more years to complete my degree.

I really like this degree because I can see myself helping international people that comes to my country to help my people and I feel like I can use this to help them as well. *Continued on page 4*

Soledad de Velasquez

Soledad was our educational director when we were at Prince of Peace Home for Girls. Since we began GGLP she has given counsel to us and we always meet with her when we go to Guatemala. In March we learned that she had experienced symptoms of a major stroke. At 42 years of age, the doctors are unsure why she would have a stroke but she is currently dealing with almost total loss of function of her left arm and leg. Thankfully she is able to speak. She is working hard in physical therapy and having some success with improved movement but the progress is very slow.

Then in early May we learned that Soledad's father passed away. They were a very close family and he had been on dialysis for several years.

Soledad continues to help us with understanding of the educational system in Guatemala and with speaking to the girls who are struggling or who need counsel.

Below is a photo of Kay and Soledad taken in October 2012. Both are crying. This was our first visit back to Guatemala after having gone through a very painful departure from Prince of Peace Home for Girls in May 2012. Soledad had been very encouraging to us through the whole process and was again expressing her love for us.

We have now been deeply involved in Guatemala for 18 years. I hope our relationship with Soledad will give you a small glimpse into the love that God has given us for Soledad, for many other Guatemalans and for their country.
