When Soledad suffered a stroke in February 2022, she lost the function of her left arm and leg. It was a very dark time as she was only 42 years old. With great courage and diligence, she fought through the rehabilitation process and now can ambulate slowly.

Previously she had completed her Masters and Doctorate in Education but was let go from her employment during the rehabilitation process.

Her family has been very supportive and Sole and her husband have started a new business teaching English and other languages online. They have secured contracts and are moving ahead. Join with us in wishing them well in this!

We reported in June that Lisdenia would graduate in July. She had completed all of her course work and only lacked passing the TOEFL Essentials exam to demonstrate proficiency in English. She thought, as we did, that her English was good enough to pass but she received a 65 and 68 was required to pass. There was not enough time left for her to retake the exam and still graduate this July.

Since it appears very likely that her sister Joselin will graduate in July 2024, Lisdenia has elected to wait and "walk the stage" with her sister next year. The really good news is that Lisdenia has been accepted and just started a 6-month internship with Ernst and Young, considered to be one of the top 4 international accounting firms.

This is a great challenge and opportunity for her.



Joselin is entering her final semester studying International Business. She has applied to a program by Disney Inc. that would bring her to the United States for 6 months to work at various locations and attend business classes to learn how the compa-

MariCruz Itzep

Two years ago MariCruz graduated with a Masters in Psychology with emphasis in counseling. After graduation she continued with her prior job with Give and Teach Ministry, in order to save money for future endeavors.

Her time at this ministry came to an end and she has decided to move out of Guatemala City to Salama, a smaller town, which is north of the city where Her mother and sister live.

MariCruz has been in the process of purchasing land there where she wants to both live and have her Psychology practice.

In order to have income for these goals, she has started a new business teaching English and began with 17 students. We wish her well and are proud of the confidence and know-how she has gained to be able to accomplish these goals. She writes :

Brief Updates

 $\mathcal{D}eisy$ In June we reported that in January Deisy fell and broke her ankle and with difficulty she finally had surgery. Unfortunately she continued to have pain and much difficulty with ambulating. We arranged for her to see a different Orthopedic surgeon in Guatemala City who informed her that she needs to have another surgery to correct the first. She is now waiting to see if the insurance will cover this as she paid for much of her first surgery. It has been a very difficult, long process.

Nincy- She began the program in 2018. She was able to complete grades 8 through 12 in 2 years and then diligently studied English for 2 years and last year began to work in an English speaking call center. For the first time her family had steady income. However over the last 2 months her husband lost his job and she began to have recurring abdominal pain. Consequently she was unable to work on many days. She has been trying to work through the government health system which is very slow. They finally reached the point of having no food and were 2 days from being evicted from their apartment. We were able to help but it will be an ongoing issue until her health is restored.

Reyna Emelia Estrada— With great sadness in May we had to release Reyna Emelia from the program. Despite multiple conversations with her, she was unable to grasp the necessity of being a truthful person. It was a particularly difficult decision because she had completed all the course work for her degree to be a Social Worker. She only lacked writing a thesis. We hope & believe that she will continue on and eventually graduate but it will be much more difficult for her.
