During that process, they have become like daughters to us. In fact, after the graduation ceremony, Jim was sitting outside with their grandmother, whom they refer to as "mother" because she has been their mother since they were 3 years old. While sitting there, watching the photographer work, the grandmother turned to Jim and said, "Those are your daughters". He simply replied, "Yes, they are".. (In Spanish, of course!). God has immensely blessed us repeatedly through the lives of these and many other Guatemalan girls and young ladies. What a privilege it has been to be a part of their lives.

#### NOW WHAT

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Joselin completed her internship at Disney in Florida in June and has returned to Guatemala. When possible, she has been working in a ministry and helping Príncipe de Paz in Guatemala, serving as a translator when American teams visit. She is currently in the process of applying for a position with Colgate to participate in an internship/training program. Please pray for her, as this is highly competitive.

Adela is in the first year of a two-year cooking program. Even after having a baby, moving to a new location, and having her husband leave to go to the States for work, she is still pursuing her dream of becoming a chef. We are proud of Adela. In order to continue with her classes, Adela's teacher wanted all class participants to have a stove with a cooktop and an oven. Many in the small village where Adela lives cook over an open fire. However, Adela was given assignments to prepare food at home and bring it to class for evaluation and testing purposes. These assignments included baking. Hesed was able to help Adela pay for the stove and oven, and she is thrilled. We look forward to future pictures of some of her creations!

Adela's husband recently came to the US to work legally. Unfortunately, he does not always have fulltime work, and Adela has to find a way to move forward without the additional income that was expected. She misses her husband, and he misses their family a lot. She says that sometimes, when he calls on the phone, he cries.

Adela has a dream of selling the items she makes. We asked her and her husband, Jorge, how they would be able to have a small business without being visited by gangs asking for extortion money to keep their business "safe". Jorge replied that this is why they moved back to the small village where he is from. The village has a volunteer militia. If they are visited by gangs from the city, the militia will kill them, and then there usually are not any more problems. How awful it is not to have police for safety.

# AZUCENA

Living by herself, working at a bookstore six days a week, and taking classes on Sundays in psychology all seem to agree with Azucena. She has taken pleasure in viewing her life and the lives of her family members through the lens of psychology. This has helped her understand some of the craziness and recognize that, because it is a discipline to be studied, craziness exists in the rest of the world as well. This realization has given her some comfort.

Additionally, Azucena desires to grow spiritually. Because of her schedule, she has to look for opportunities to find Christian friends and attend services or a small group when she can. We are proud of her and the decisions she is making to move forward and grow spiritually.

Our visit with Yojana was short, but we were able to see that she has improved in her attitude and outlook concerning the extortion call that changed her life a year ago. She has not been able to return to work for a ministry, so she is still working in a call center with a minimal 1.5hour commute each way. Over time, the fear of the extortionist has decreased. She is now hoping to have the opportunity to return to ministry, perhaps working with teams from the U.S. Her English is good, and she would be a good leader.

She is entering her last year at the university, studying social work. It will be a very challenging year, as she will have a large project to complete in addition to writing an in-depth thesis.

## NEYDI LIZET

Neydi has been through a lot. She endured a difficult pregnancy and then took time off from classes to care for her new baby, Austin.

Afterward, she and the baby's father went through adjustments and some counseling, and now she has returned to work. The baby is in the care of a neighbor, and Neydi has returned to class. She continues to study criminal justice, and her grades are good.
