NOTE: this email refers to the 2020 International Council election, not to be confused with the 2020 ESA Foundation election, which ended yesterday for all eligible ESAF voters.

This message is for all ESA members in good standing with their ESA dues (paid by May 1) and whose chapter dues are in good standing with the International Council regarding the upcoming election of the ESA International Council Executive Board.

International Council voting will be done electronically: On July 2, you will be receiving an email from the ESA International Council through a program called Election Runner. This email will provide a link to the election site where you will have the opportunity to vote electronically for the candidates running for the IC Executive Board. The link will be available to you for one week. The Election will close on July 9, 2020 at 11:00pm Mountain Time.

When you receive your email, you will also receive a voter ID and voter key. You will not have to enter those to get into your ballot if you use the link provided in the email. You will not be able to vote a second time or make any changes to the vote after it has been submitted, so cast the vote you desire.

It will be particularly important that you watch for your email. Your email will come from the ESA International Council <noreply@electionrunner.com>. It is possible that some email servers will not accept certain emails or consider them Spam. If you don't receive the email, please check your Spam and Clutter folders first and if you still do not get it, contact LeAnn Wray immediately at 2020.esa.ic.convention@gmail.com so we can send your ballot manually.

If you are the main contact for an entity (Past State Presidents group, State District, State or Regional Council, Past International Council President, etc.), you will receive one ballot for your personal vote and another ballot for the entity vote. Please be incredibly careful and vote accordingly when casting these votes as they cannot be changed after they have been submitted.

The second box is for additional team members, if you are paying for more than yourself. In this box, you will list **name and email address** for other team members you are paying for. DO NOT LIST YOUR NAME IN THIS SECOND BOX.

Next, is the Quantity box. This is where you enter how many people you are paying for. Example: if you are just paying for yourself, your quantity is "1"! If you are paying for yourself and two other friends, your quantity is "3".

Once you enter your quantity, click the gold button that says "Attend". If it doesn't take you to your cart, click view cart at the top of the page on right hand side. Check your shopping cart to make sure it is correct.

If Cart is correct, click the gold button that says "Checkout". This will take you to the payment page. We need your email address, name and phone number entered here. Once you have entered it, click the black button that says "Next". This takes you to payment page, you will enter your payment information here. Once you have entered payment info, click the black button that says "Next". This will take you to the review page. Look over the information, if correct click "Submit". You are done.

DO NOT WANT TO PLAY TRIVA, BUT WANT TO SUPPORT THE INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL?

Below the gold "Get tickets" button, you will find information about donating to the International Council. You may choose from a preset dollar amount, by clicking on the amount you choose or you may choose an amount of your own. To enter a donation amount that isn't one of the presets, click the \$0.00 button and enter the amount you would like to donate. Once you have picked either a preset amount or an amount of your choosing, click the gold "Donate" button. If it doesn't take you to your cart, click view cart at the top of the page on right hand side. Check your shopping cart to make sure it is correct.

If Cart is correct, click the gold button that says "Checkout". This will take you to the payment page. We need your email address, name and phone number entered here. Once you have entered info, click the black button that says "Next". On this page you enter your payment information. Once you have entered payment info, click the black button that says "Next". This will take you to the review page. Look over the information, if correct click "Submit". You are done.


needed to be done with grace and finesse. I am proud to announce that both of our Dream Homes sold out of tickets. The saying is true, persistence overcomes resistance.

Sign up for SurveyPlanet:


1. Go to www.surveypalnet.com
2. Click "Get Started"
3. Sign up for SurveyPlanet by submitting your name, email and a password. Use the free version unless you are interested in the additional paid service.

Create a Survey:


1. Once you are logged in, click "New Survey"



2. Name your survey, select whether you want a person to include their email when filling out the survey, and add a welcome message if you'd like one.


3. Begin adding your questions. There are very basic templates pre-loaded into the system. You can explore those but adding your own questions may be a better option for most surveys.




4. In the sidebar, type your question and select the question type.

a. Question types:


i. **Multiple Choice:** allow participants to select one or multiple responses. Write in your own response choices.



ii. **Essay:** Allow participants to type in their response.



iii. **Rating:** Allows participants to select one option from a variety of options (ie. Agree – Disagree, Satisfied – Unsatisfied, etc.)



iv. Value: Allow participants to answer on a sliding scale (ie. 1-10)



vi. Scoring: Allow participants to score multiple areas.




vii. **Date and Time:** Allow participants to select a date.



5. Once you complete a question, click "save question".




6. Once you get the notification that your question has been saved, click the back button to add another question.




7. Click "New Question" and repeat until you have your survey completed.


8. Preview your survey by selecting "Preview". This will allow you to go through the survey as if you were responding to it.



9. Click "Settings" and add some additional requirements. You can select how you want the questions to display (one question at a time or all at once) and if you want to prevent multiple submissions from the same device (prevent the same person from answering multiple times from the same computer).



10. Once you are happy with the survey, turn it to "active" and select "Share" to copy and paste the URL to the survey into an email to send to participants.



11. To view results, click "Results" to review responses to each question and the names of the people who have responded. Once you are satisfied with the number of responses, turn the survey back to "Inactive" to prevent people from continuing to respond after the deadline.
