### **From Parliamentarian Casey**

Season Greetings from your Parliamentarian! I am Casey Hoffman from Mississippi, and I am honored to serve as your Parliamentarian. I grew up in a military family and we lived a life of service. 32 years ago, I was invited to join ESA and my life of service continued! It is a blessing for me to be involved in all of our philanthropic endeavors. I will be sending out reminders to review our bylaws and consider changes that may be appropriate, but for right now, I wanted to share a tasty and easy recipe from my heart to yours. This is a great recipe for the holiday season and one that is fun to make with children.

#### Pecan Pie Balls 2 ½ cups chopped pecans 1 cup graham cracker crumbs

1 cup light brown sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract
½ cup maple syrup 6 tbsp melted butter
1 (24 ounce) pkg chocolate almond bark (or melting chocolate)

Combine pecans, graham cracker crumbs, brown sugar, vanilla, and maple syrup. Stir to combine. Add the melted butter and mix until it comes together and can be shaped into balls. Shape the mixture into 1-inch balls. Place the balls on a parchment (or waxed paper) lined baking sheet. Place in the refrigerator or freezer for at least an hour. Melt the chocolate according to the package directions. Dip the pecan pie balls into the melted chocolate and put them on more parchment or waxed paper. You can cover them with sprinkles if you choose. Let them set. That is it! So easy. These can be kept at room temp for about three days. Keep them in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to a month. You can also freeze them for future use.

We all know that this fund has helped so many members in SERC and we have to keep the fund going. Why not start now and have a fundraiser in your own state or chapter—You can have a contest, draw numbers, spin the wheel or drop ping pong balls in muffins tins to find out how much you owe. Use your imagination. This is a fun way to raise some money for the IC Disaster Fund. Every little bit helps our members. Some of you may not know a lot about the IC Disaster Fund. Well, it was started at the 1956 IC Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico and its purpose is to assist an ESA member who has encountered some nature catastrophe such as a fire, flood, hurricane, etc, and their home or personal belongings have been destroyed or damaged extensively. Or it could be a member who has incurred a debilitating illness or accident, which involves the member or their spouse or immediate family who resides in the home due to physical or mental impairment whom they have legal guardship over and are legally responsible. The Disaster Fund is for Active members (90 days or more), members at large (MALS) who are in good standing with Headquarters and, Life Active Members.

The maximum amount given is \$8,000. You can apply by using the ESA IC Disaster Fund Application which is found on the website. Once this is completed and signed by the member, the application form and any additional information (e,g., proof of the reason for the claim) is sent to the International Council Disaster Fund Chair (currently the IC Junior Past President, which is Denise Holdaway).
