#### **DISASTER FUND CALLING!**

Are you ready for Spring! I sure am! Today, it is raining and a good time to clean off my desk and do some filing and some tasks that I have been putting off like writing this article!

As your past SERC President, I am your Disaster Fund Chair for the Southeastern Regional Council.

I am attaching a copy of the ESA International Council Disaster Fund Application and the IC Disaster Fund Guidelines. Each state usually has their own donation form for the Disaster Fund. These donations need to be send to the IC Disaster Fund Chair, Denise Holdaway, 902 Pierce Lane, Blytheville, AR 72315. Please send me a copy of your form so I can keep track of SERC's contributions to this Fund. Also, please distribute this info as necessary. They can be also found on the IC website.

Many of us in the Southeastern Regional Council have used this fund. It is meant to assist an ESA member whose home and/or personal belongings are damaged or destroyed extensively by one of nature's causes—fire, flood, earthquake, etc. Also, it can be used when a member incurs heavy financial responsibility due to a debilitating sickness or accident, which involved the member or their spouse or immediate family who resides in the house due to physical or mental impairment whom they have legal partnership over and are legally responsible.

So, you see, this covers a wide range of unforeseen circumstances. This fund was established back in 1956 and the total amount that can be given is \$8,000.

And, of course, the three top states contributing the most money will also be recognized at the SERC Awards Luncheon.
