Dear Friends,

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

Note that the phrase above, the Easter Acclamation," does not say "has risen," nor "did rise," neither does it say, "was risen." Christ is risen; tells that resurrection is a present tense reality. Sure, there is a future tense hope for the utmost fulfillment of that resurrection reality, but resurrection is very much present in the here and now.

Easter Sunday's sermon ended with something along the lines of, "Christ is risen. And, so are you. And, so am I. So, let's get outside of these four walls into the world that God loves, and live it. Amen."

I ended the sermon in that fashion because...

How we live resurrection makes a tremendous difference in our approach to daily life, to mission, to ministry, to attitude, and to faith application. It's a matter of faithful service, hope, and new life. It comes down to how we understand resurrection. It's how all the resurrection talk about faithful service, hope, and new life is embodied through Easter Sunday worship. And, by being embodied through Easter Sunday worship, how that resurrection talk about faithful service, hope, and new life gets embodied through Easter Sunday worshipers living that reality "now, henceforth, and forevermore." Resurrection talk that somehow doesn't become embodied by worshipers seems thin and useless. It comes down to this: "is resurrection a future event or is it a present reality?" Or, "what if it is both!"

What direction does faithful service, hope, and new life take if resurrection is seen as a right-here-right-now present reality? What direction does faithful service, hope, and new life take if resurrection is seen as a someday-further-down-the-road event? Seems that one of those "takes on resurrection" is more meaningful and hope-filled than the other, right? Seems that one also leaves us hollow, as empty as the tomb, rife with profoundly devaluing disposability? For if value comes at some future date, rather than in the present, then why value the present at all? Or, why not treat it as the empty take-out box that it seems? Devoid of present purpose and empty of nourishing contents for this present day. Seems that resurrection is somehow sweeter in the right-here-right-now realities of life, than in some future hoped for time when reality of future resurrection will lift open the metaphoric lid of our sacred take-out box so that we might dine on pie in the sky in the sweet by and by. No pie for you! Not now! You wait!

Spend some time this Easter season wrestling with what resurrection means right-here-right-now. And, to continue that pondering of grace, let's pray:

"God of mercy, we no longer look for Jesus among the dead, for he is alive and has become the Lord of life. Increase in our minds and hearts the risen life we share with Christ, and help us to grow as your people toward the fullness of eternal life with you, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen."*

I was so moved by this that I came back to the church and told this story to Pastor Bryant and few of the ladies from the knitting group who were still at the church. As I am telling the story, I started to cry. The thought of children not being able to have new clothes was heartbreaking.

On Maundy Thursday, Erik and I took the backpacks to the school. The same guidance counselor was at the front of the school and proceeded to tell me that with the 25 Walmart Gift Cards, they were able buy clothes for the three students, shoes for a few more students and make five Easter food baskets for five needy families. She continued by telling me that without the generous help from JOY, none of this would have been possible.

It is simply hard to fathom the overall need at Turner Elementary School for assistance. Yes, maybe we do a lot for Turner, but truly the need is great and every bit of assistance we can provide the students and their families is greatly appreciated.

Turner is our neighbor and weren't we taught "to love our neighbors as our ourselves". Well, we need to love Turner.

I hope this helps all of us to understand the enormous need at Turner and why we have these campaigns several times a year.


